Last year, BISD stepped into a new era--the high school moved into its new building, middle school moved to the old high school building, and the elementary loosened its belt.

This year, all three schools are STEPPIN' Out--'94. Each is becoming a distinct division, yet interdependent on each other, such is a family.

Each grade, each school builds upon each other. The Annual and Chat Staff hopes to show that growth in pictures and words.

Most families annually buy a yearbook. These books become a treasured part of their family history because a yearbook "never forgets"--former students, trips taken by groups, and little memories that constitute school life.

The staff's problem this year is keeping the price of the yearbook at \$20 while showing the additional students. Our school has grown from 720 to 762 this year.

School Board makes policy decisions to keep education current for BISSD students

Their five year planning sessions addressed this need and state goals, parental and community involvement, recruiting and retaining qualified teachers, adopting instructional technologies, inservice training, and meeting special student populations.

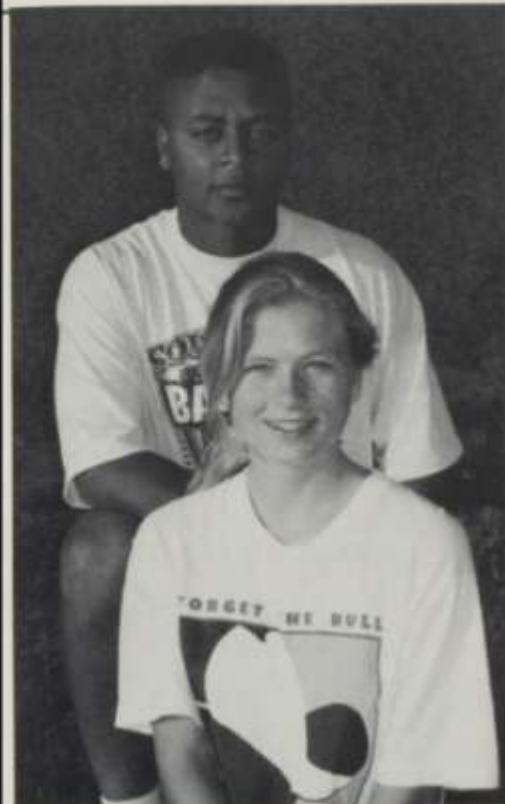

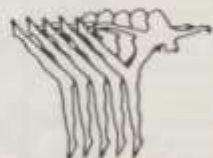
