## *13 Schools Into 1*

Our theme for the 1976 Bi-Centennial Yearbook is "The way we were-The way we are."

Many aspects of school life have changed since school started in Blanco in the 1800's. A few of the changes are shown on these pages. Students arrive at our school in many different ways than the traditional horseback and foot of yesterday.

The school we now attend is really a combination of about 13 small schools combined into one school. The last school to consolidate with the present school was in the fifties. Some of the schools that are a part of our school now are the Lindendale School, Peyton Place or Colony School, Centerville School (Bunnard Roost), Liveoak School, Twin Sisters School, Old Rock School, Mountain View School, Chimney Valley School, McKinney School, Flat Creek School, and Kentalia School. Many of these old one and two room schools are still around and used for various activities.

The original school has really met in many different buildings since it first started in the 1870's. In 1850, the two story school building shown on the preceding page burned and school was finished in the Methodist Church Building. For the next 10 years, school was held in the vacant court house building, which had been moved to Johnson City since 1891.

In 1902, classes were again held in the two story building, but in 1918, the state condemned the building and the structure that now houses the band hall was built on the two story site. The present high school building was built in 1940 and our new elementary was built in 1966.

## 38 Years Of FFA

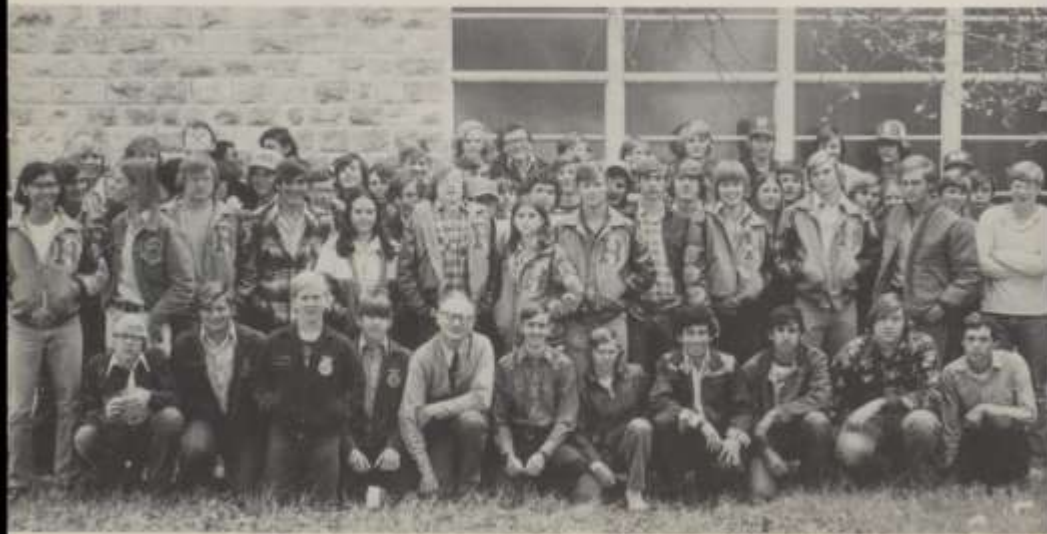


The Future Farmers of America was chartered in 1938. Since then it has grown to be an organization of sixty-eight members.

Blanco High School hasn't always had a regular yearbook like we know it today. Up until 1940, the school published a catalog instead. The BLANCO HIGH SCHOOL CATALOG published in 1937 did not have any pictures and was more like the collage catalogs of today. For example, it told about the courses of study and the rates of tuition. It also stated that there were 239 students enrolled-135 males and 104 females. The school session that year opened September 1, and closed June 22. Courses such as Latin, Greek, and German were taught along with the regular English, Government, and Math.

In 1940 there came a change. That was the year the first annual was published. It had twenty-five pages of students, faculty, and activities, and five pages of advertisements. There was also a picture of the new high school, the one we are in now. That first annual was dedicated to the Superintendent, Mr. S. P. Cowan.

This year the Annual Staff started publishing a school newspaper, the PANTHER CHAT. We learned a lot putting out the paper and we learned even more from our work with the annual. We hope the 1976 PANTHER will be something we can be proud of in the tradition started by those students in 1940.
