

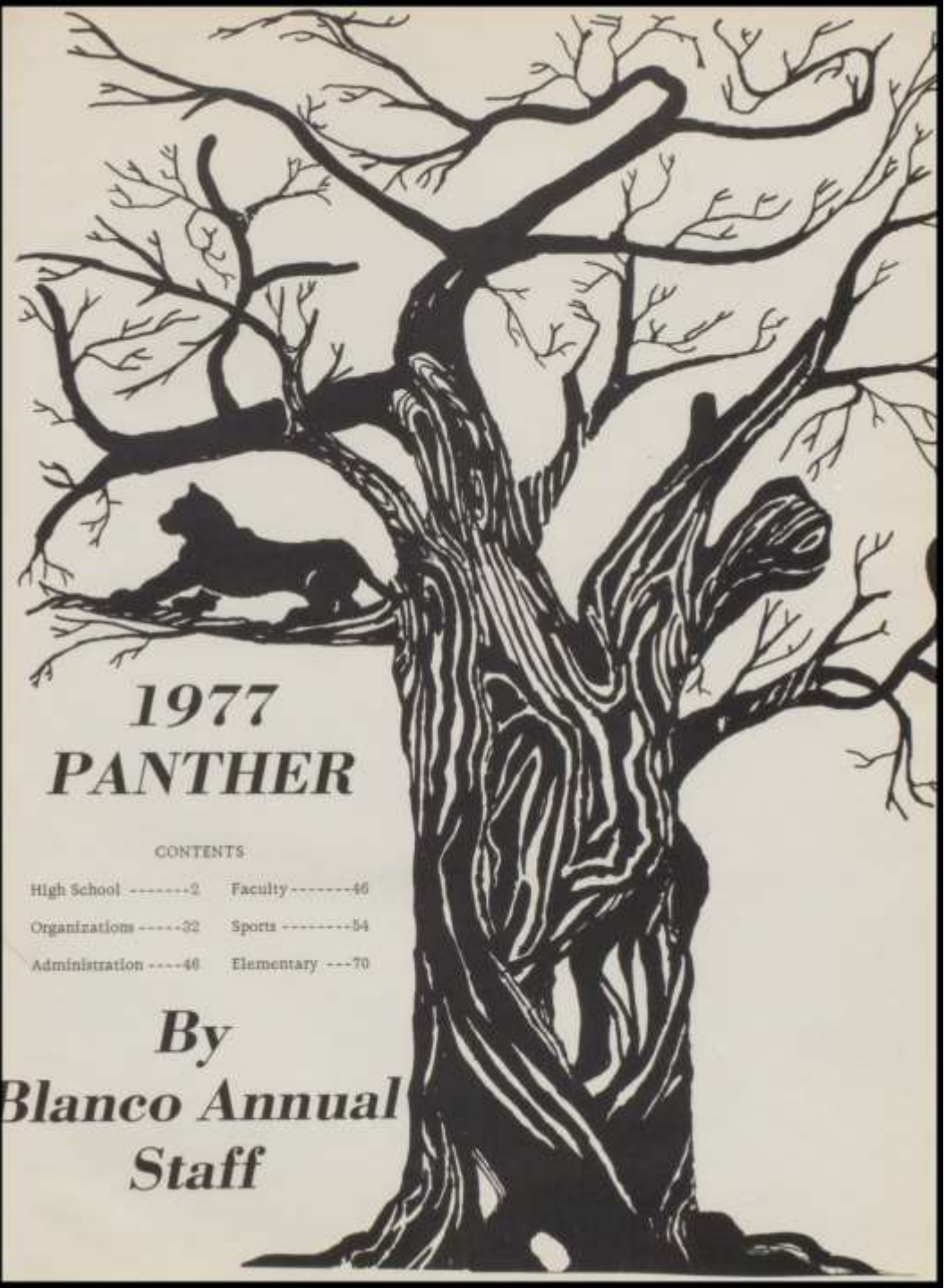

# FFA—Building Our American Communities



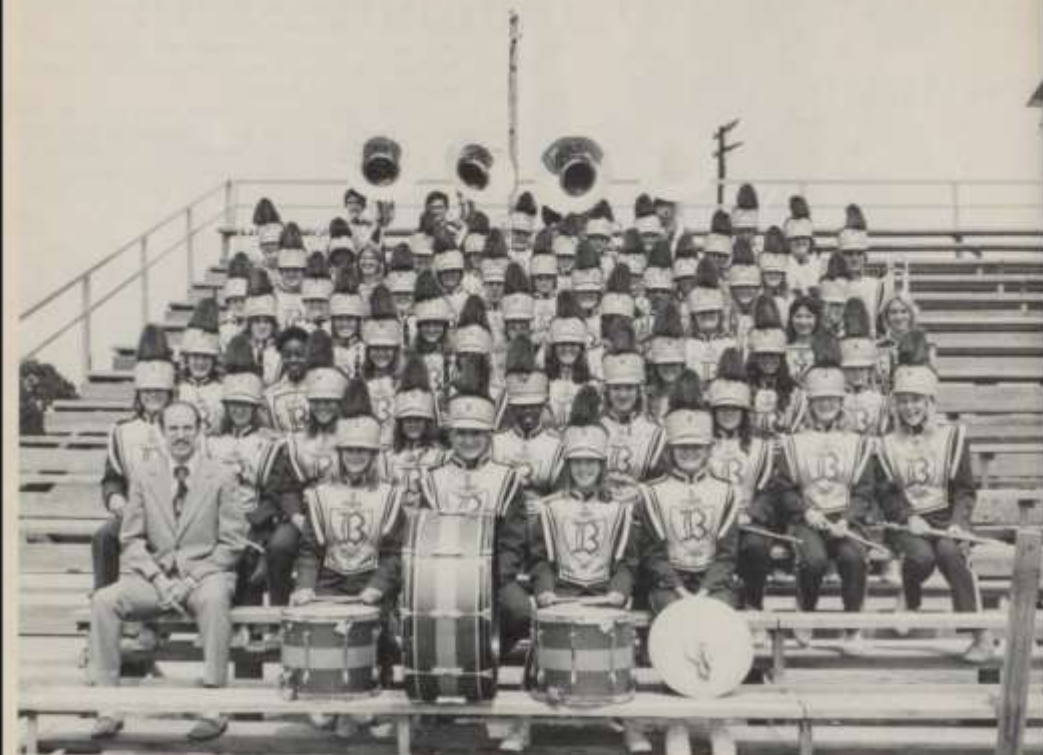
