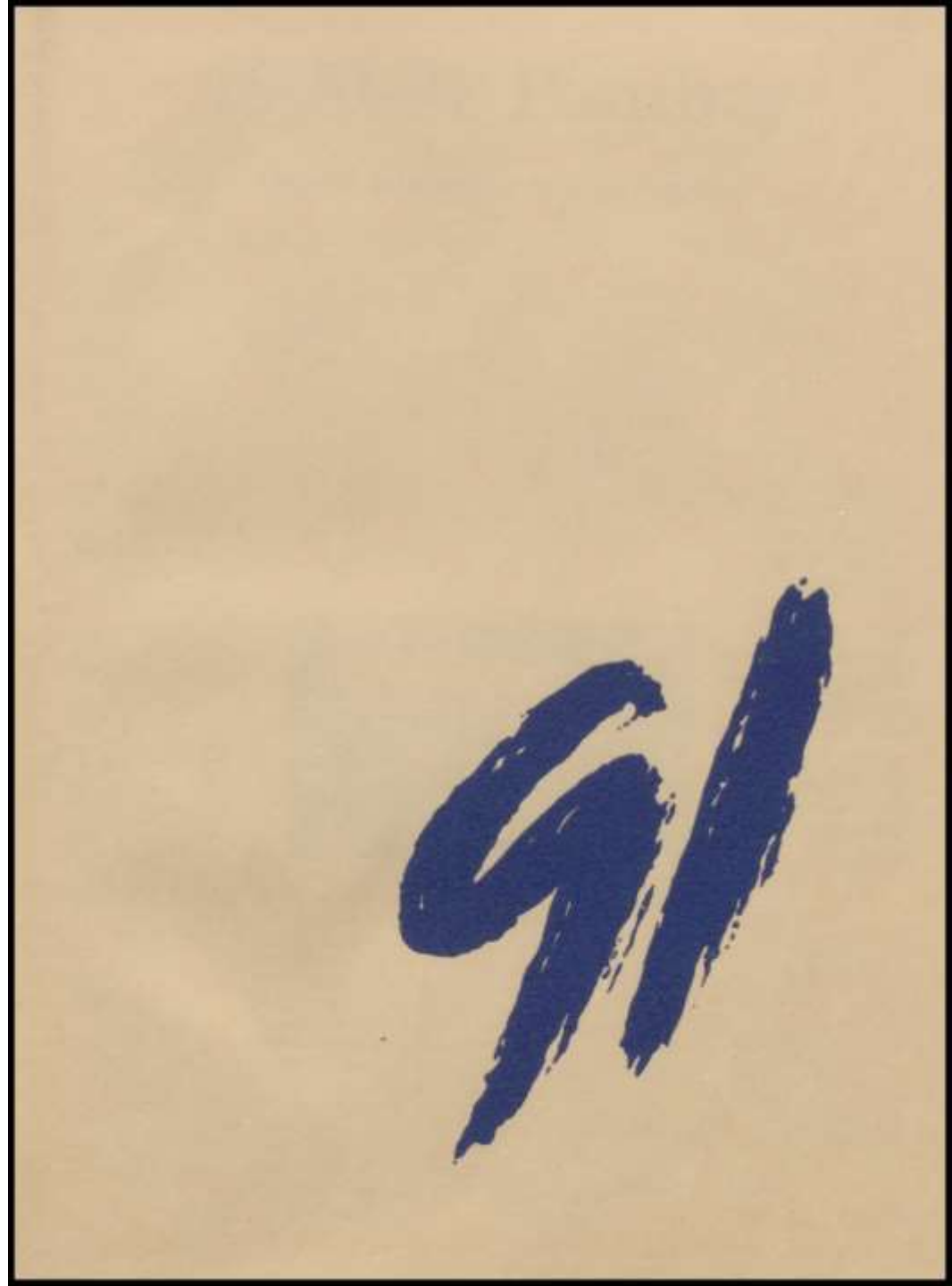
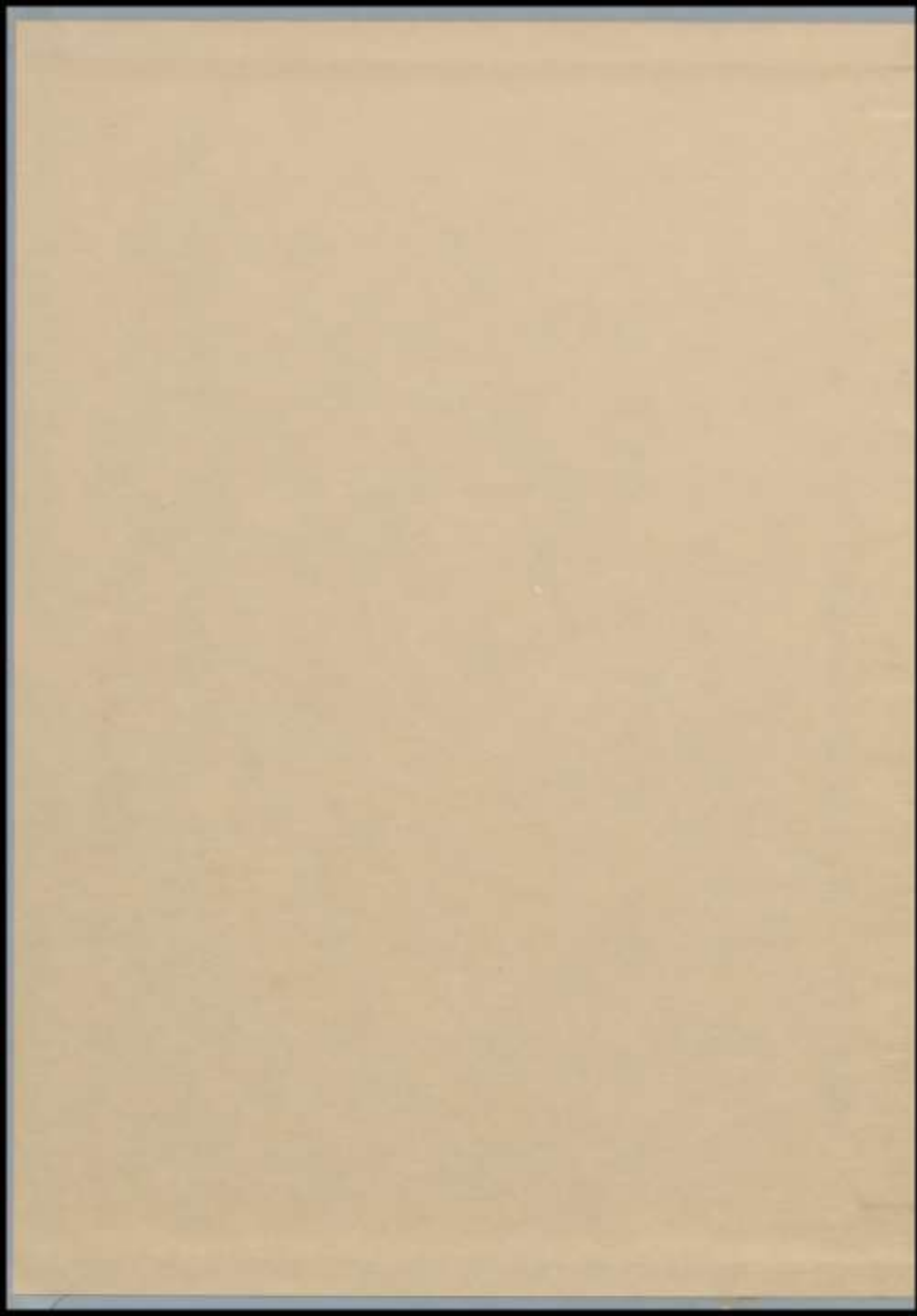

# Goal--helping others recall BIRD's history

Remembering the past is the goal of the Yearbook and Chat Staff. Their job is to *ALWAYS* keep up-to-date with what "goes on" with all the students and staff of BHS.

Monthly they produce the *PANTHER CHAT* informing the community and the people at school the honors and accomplishments of the school. Not only do they gather information and write stories, they sell ads to businesses in town so that every student can have a free copy of the *CHAT*. The school newspaper has been produced for 16 years. Some students keep a copy at home so they will not forget their time at BHS.

Yearly, the staff produces the *PANTHER*, the yearbook you are now reading. They try to spell everyone's name correctly and record the events and honors of students so that they will never be forgotten.

The yearbook costs over \$6,000 to produce. The staff raises this money through sales of the yearbook (\$20), picture sales, and advertising. For each yearbook the staff members sell, they get \$.50 off the price of theirs. They not only learn how to layout and produce a book, they learn salesmanship.

The staff designated *ALWAYS* as the theme of the 1991 *PANTHER* because there are many things that *ALWAYS* stay the same, but yet *ALWAYS* change with every fleeting hour and day.

"Desert Storm," our country's first war in many years, set about change at the entire school, county, state, country, and world. It influenced their lives, made them doubt, but *ALWAYS* helped them believe in the "Good Old USA!"

## UIL competition always enriches the classroom



For 40 minutes, Tracy Edens (front) and Mandy Oran answered questions on **Current Issues and Events**, National daily newspapers or Texas metropolitan newspapers, business newspapers, specialized periodicals, weekly news magazines, journals of political or social nature, and other periodicals that report, summarize or explain world events composed the nature of the test. A five breaker composed of an essay had to be written by them of approximately 200 words in length. Tracy placed 4th and was able to go to the regional meet because the 3rd place individual could not attend.

Colt Petri (front) took the 80 question test on **Science**, whose purpose is to challenge high school students to do a wide range of reading in the areas of science. Victor Tapia took two 5-minute timed writings in the **Keyboarding** contest on an electric typewriter which he works in the regular classroom.

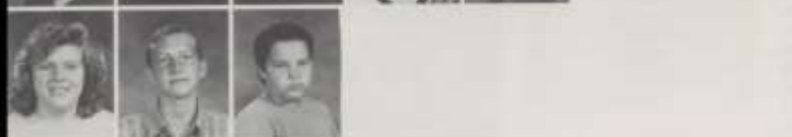

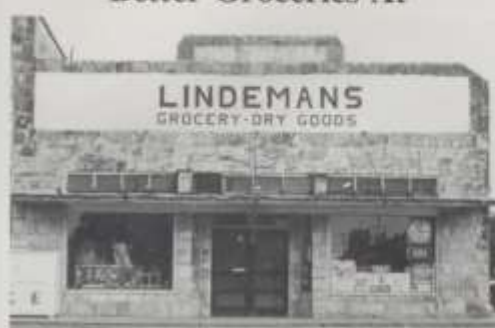
